- In all medical specialties: medical malpractice lawsuit verdicts favor the defendant in 90% of cases.
- Top paid claims in OBGYN:
 - 1. Brain damaged infant
 - 2. Birth trauma
 - 3. Accidental injury/laceration
- Top allegations in OBGYN:
 - o Delay in treatment of fetal distress
 - o Improper management of vaginal delivery
 - Important to document clinical findings and informed consent
 - o Improper management of pregnancy
 - Important to document labs, tests, and patient noncompliance
- The "4 D's" of medical malpractice: Breech of Duty, Dereliction, Direct cause, Damage
- 2 case examples reviewed:
 - Case #1: Shoulder dystocia following vacuum delivery with 9 pulls.
 Baby with permanent brachial plexus injury
 - Allegation: improper management of operative vaginal delivery
 - Case #2: Uterine rupture following trial of labor after cesarean.
 Physician was not in house. Cesarean section performed within 30 minutes.
 - Allegation: breech of standard of care (immediate availability of physician).
- How to improve patient safety outcomes:
 - o Review records and cases
 - Report errors
 - o Improve communications (among clinic staff, hospital staff, patients)
 - o Peer review in every clinic.
